- Ask your child to tell you the school rules
- Ask your child to discuss examples of ways that he or she can use these rules to help them to learn and participate at school.
- Discuss ways that these rules can be used at home and in the community.

Consequences for Inappropriate Behavior

Students have been taught the school rules for classroom and nonclassroom settings. Expected behaviors are constantly re-taught throughout the year. If a child does not follow the expected behavior, the following procedure is followed:

- Individual reminder of what the expected behavior is at that time.
- 2. Individual verbal warning with a possible time out in the classroom and a repetition of expected behavior.
- Repetition of expected behavior, possible time out in a different classroom, and a MIR (MINOR Incident Report) slip goes home to parents/guardians.
- 4. If the behavior still does not improve, administration will be called in to intervene.

MIR Slips are a way to communicate with adults at home and are meant as a learning tool.

Tuffy Tickets

Students who are following the school rules in the various locations of the school can earn Tuffy Tickets.

- Tickets are given by staff to students to acknowledge their positive behavior.
- Once received, the students collect their tickets to trade in for various rewards.
- Students can save up their tickets for a bigger reward or trade them in more quickly for a smaller reward.
- Rewards are special privileges the students can earn. A few examples are sitting in a special seat for the day, being first to pick special classroom jobs, or telling a joke in the cafeteria during lunchtime.

Be Responsible

Classroom:	Do your school work and turn it in.
Lunch/Recess:	Clear your table in the cafeteria and return all playground equipment.
Home:	Help with housework.
Community:	Keep the neighborhood clean.
Be Ready to Learn	
School:	Have school supplies needed at the start of each class.

- Lunch/Recess: Be prepared to listen to a change in directions.
- Home: Get your backpack ready for school the night before.

Community: Know safety rules.
