If your child is unable to open/access the food independently, it is not recommended for school.



SEL/Social Emotional Learning

Social Emotional Learning Program

- To help students become caring, responsible members of their school communities and grow into humane, principled, and skilled citizens of democratic society by:
- Building caring relationships
- Explicitly teaching social and emotional skills
- Creating calm, orderly learning environments through effective classroom management
- Helping students develop self-discipline through a teachingand-learning approach to discipline

Math

During Quarter 1 students will:

- Count objects to 20 to tell how many using basic arrangements, varied arrangements, and representations of numbers on ten frames and dot cards
- Identify squares, circles, triangles, rectangles, and hexagons in the environment
- Identify cubes, cones, cylinders, and spheres in the environment
- Use positional words to describe the relationship between objects (eg. above, below, in front of, etc)
- Classify objects into categories using color, shape, size, height, length, weight
- Describe measurable attributes; length, height, weight, and capacity
- Compare objects by length, height, weight, and capacity
- Compare numbers to 20, connect to above standard
- Count to 50 starting at 1, use objects, number charts, number paths/lines
- Count to 50 starting off a number other than 1
- Identify patterns within counting

ELA: Reading

During Quarter 1 students will:

- learn the letters of the alphabet.
- learn and practice independent work habits and routines.
- build confidence in their oral reading abilities through choral reading
- discuss concepts of word and print.
- develop their phonological awareness by identifying rhyming words
- do stretches, posture activities, and gross-motor movements to prepare for letter-formation instruction.
- practice capital letter formation during handwriting.
- recognize common types of texts (e.g., storybooks, poems).
- identify the front cover, back cover, and title page of a book.

ELA: Writing

During Quarter 1 students will:

- build a community of writers.
- generate ideas from read-alouds.
- write stories using drawing, letter-like symbols, or standard letters or words.
- generate ideas for writing by visualizing, observing, and making lists.
- draw pictures to tell stories.

Science

Big Ideas of Science in Kindergarten

- Quarter 1 Scientists and Engineers
 - We will learn what scientists and engineers do. Intro to science.
- Quarter 2 Weather
 - We will learn about the different types of weather and how it impacts our daily lives.
- Quarter 3 Pushes and Pulls
 - We will investigate the different types of forces.
- Quarter 4 Relationships in the Ecosystem
 - We will learn about cycles and what living things need to live and grow.

Student Home Screening Protocol

 Parent/guardians are expected to perform a symptom check every day before the student leaves home.

Student Home Screening Protocol

Parents/guardians should keep their children home if they are experiencing symptom(s)
associated with any communicable disease, including COVID-19. In addition,
parents/guardians are to perform the following COVID-19 health check every day before the student leaves home.

A child should NOT come to school with any of these symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher
- Sore throat
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- New onset of severe headache (especially with fever), or
- New loss of taste or smell

For persons with chronic conditions such as asthma, the symptoms should represent a change from baseline.

Children exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 are to be kept home and may not attend school.



Student Home Screening Protocol

- •Unvaccinated students and staff should stay home if he or she has been in close contact* with anyone who tested positive for COVID-19 or is suspected** of having COVID-19.
- •The CDC continues to recommend a 14-day quarantine, however, based on local circumstances and resources, there are two possible options to shorten quarantine are acceptable alternatives.

Notes From the Health Room

Regarding COVID-19

- If a student complains of any Covid-19 like symptoms at school, staff will notify the Health Room.
- Health staff will evaluate the student and protect the student's confidentiality.
- Staff will follow the triage protocol from MSDE/MDH and determine if a student will be sent home or return to class.

Notes From the Health Room

Regarding COVID-19

- An isolation room is available for those students who will need to wait to be picked up to go home.
- As much as possible, healthy children will be kept out of the health room in order to minimize possible exposure to illness.
- Teachers will have health kits in their classrooms (band aids, basic items, etc.)
