Recently there has been an increase in the number of students who are ill. In order to keep our students as healthy as possible, we ask you to assist us by keeping children home from school when they are ill. The isolation of ill students at home can help to prevent the spread of illness in the school. Also, remember that despite concerns about school attendance, your children's health (and the health of other children) is most important. For this reason, we ask you to please: Keep your child home if he/she has a fever of over 100.0. A fever indicates that your child has an infection that could be passed to other students. If you give your child Motrin or Tylenol, the fever will, of course, disappear but he/she will still be contagious to others. Children must be fever-free for 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school!

Call the school nurse (410-880-5893) to let us know if your child is absent with a contagious illness such as strep throat, or the flu etc. Please provide any

etc. Please provide any documentation from your physician about diagnosis and release to return to school. (Ear and sinus infections, while often a reason for keeping a child home, are usually not contagious.) Frequent hand washing is known to reduce the spread of disease. Please encourage your children to wash their hands frequently, especially after toileting, before eating

and when ill. Thank you for your help in keeping all of our students healthy!

The doors to the school open at <u>8:45am</u>. Prior to this time staff members are not outside to supervise students who arrive early. If your child walks to school or if you drive your child to school, please have him/her arrive between <u>8:45am and</u> <u>8:55am</u>.

Please label coats and clothes!

Hammond's lost and found grows very quickly, especially throughout the winter months. Please label your child's coat, sweatshirts, etc. with their last name and if there is room their first name as well. This will help ensure that we can return their coats/clothes if they lose them.

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
