# It's Time to Register for Kindergarten

Registration for students entering Kindergarten in August 2015 starts on Monday, March 2<sup>nd</sup> and runs through Friday, March 6<sup>th</sup> from 9:30am-2:30pm, and until 7pm on Wednesday, March 4<sup>th</sup>. Parents or guardians are to register students at the school serving the address where the child's parent or guardian resides. The following documents are

needed for registration: \*Child's birth certificate or passport

\*An authorized record of immunizations

\*Proof of residency in the form of a lease or deed and a utility bill

\*Photo ID of parent/guardian If you have a child currently attending an HCPSS PreK program, *there is no need to reregister your student for Kindergarten*.
