# Bullying Behavior Prevention Tip of the Month

# TIP #2

# Tell a trusted adult, like a family member, teacher or coach.

An adult can help stop bullying by intervening while it's in progress, preventing it in the first place or simply giving the person being bullied a shoulder to lean on.

- Bystanders can tell a trusted adult in person or leave them a note.
- If bullying is occurring, bystanders can go find, or ask a friend to find, a trusted adult as soon as possible. The adult could help stop it from continuing.
- Remind children who witness bullying not to get discouraged if they've already talked to an adult and it appears nothing has changed. They can ask a family member if they will help, and make sure the adult knows if and when the behavior is repeated over time.
- Try talking to as many adults as possible if there's a problem—teachers, counselors, custodians, nurses, and parents. The more adults involved, the better.
