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Do you wonder where your PTA donations go? Here are the highlights of our recent spending. Since January 1st, we have provided a \$2,400 grant to replace the fence around the school garden near the recess playground. We have reimbursed approximately \$1,100 to teachers and staff for classroom supplies and about \$1,200 to host the staff luncheon during parent-teacher conferences. We put down approximately \$2,500 in deposits towards amusements (games and inflatables) and entertainment (magician) for the Spring Carnival coming up next month. We spent \$2,000 in costs associated with the Wizards basketball game (tshirts for our staff team, hotel for the Wizards, concessions for resale at the game, and advertising).

Known upcoming expenses include the outstanding balances, prizes and food and for the spring carnival (estimated \$3,000); an author visit for Literacy Night on April 14th (approximately \$700); and two upcoming field trips for 3rd grade (\$1,200 total).
