### **Our Expectations:**

## **Grade 5 Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA)**

Students in 5th grade will take the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA) assessment on March 4th, March 5th, March 7th and March 8th. Students who are absent on the testing dates will participate in a makeup session during the March 4th-22nd testing window. MISA measures student achievement on the Maryland Content Standards in Science in Grade 5 (testing content from Grades 3, 4 and 5). # **UPCOMING: Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program** (MCAP)

Students in grades 3-5 will take the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) during the month of April and/or May. The MCAP assessments measure student achievement on the Maryland College and Career Ready Standards in English language arts and math. The Simulated Congressional Hearings are an exciting rite of passage for our 5th graders. We are busy preparing already for this event on May 31.




## COUNCIL OF ELDERS: HEALTHY AND UNHEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS

#### **BULLYING PREVENTION**

We wanted to remind you that HCPSS is dedicated to providing a safe and supportive environment that focuses on student well-being. We are taking this time to uplift the importance of reporting any type of bullying that has occurred. We will be reviewing this with our students and staff as we start the second half of the school year, and hope that you too can uplift this at home.

For children facing the emotional toll of bullying, a supportive individual can make all the difference. Please encourage your children to reach out to a trusted staff member at school should they need to report anything. As parents and guardians, you will use the same reporting form as students by following the steps outlined below.

### How do I report bullying?

- 1. When you believe bullying has taken place, you should report it through the Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment and Intimidation (BCHI) reporting form. Reporting can take place in one of three ways:
  - a. Complete a <u>BCHI online reporting form</u>
  - b. BCHI paper reporting form (available in the main office, staff workroom, school counseling office, media center, and health services office
  - c. An oral report to a staff member
- 2. It is important to note that policy states "in the event the reporting party does not complete a BCHI Reporting Form, school administrators/supervisors will take the appropriate steps to address and document the incident." Therefore, if you or someone else makes an oral report, it then must be documented (i.e. through a BCHI reporting form) by the administrator.

## **OUTDOOR RECESS**

Cold weather has arrived!!! We wanted to remind you that students will still be going outside for recess each day. Please make sure you send your child to school with warm clothes. All clothing needs to be labeled with your child's name. Below you will find the HCPSS criteria we consider when having outdoor activities.

- Temperature and humidity
- Wind chill
- Heat index and air quality
- Age of students
- Length of time outdoors
- Adequacy of the children's clothing
- Condition of the playground
- Falling precipitation (more than a sprinkle or mist)
- Thunder and lightning

Generally, it is assumed that students will be outside for recess, physical education, or any other outdoor activity when the temperature combined with the wind chill is not less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit or the heat index is less than 95.
