PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Hammond families,

As the spring approaches, we are excited to begin celebrating Hammond Elementary School's 50th Birthday! For those who do not know, the inaugural year of Hammond Elementary was the 1971 - 1972 school year. As a result, the 2021 - 2022 school year marks 50 years of excellence. We are excited to include the celebration as a part of the PTA-Sponsored Carnival on Saturday, May 7th and we look forward to celebrating Tuffy the Tiger's 50th Birthday during Field Day on Thursday, May 19th. For both celebrations to be a success, we rely on the volunteer efforts of our school community. Please be on the lookout for more information about how you can contribute to these exciting upcoming events.

Happy Ramadan to our Muslim families. Ramadan begins the evening of April 2nd this year. Any students who are fasting and attending school in-person may request an alternative activity during their lunch period. Please email our school counselor, Mrs. Kennedy (mkennedy@hcpss.org) if you would like for your child to have an alternative activity while fasting.

As our students continue to enjoy the opportunity to interact and learn with their peers in person, we recognize that our students benefit from daily reminders to demonstrate Tuffy's 3-R's. Each day we remind students to be:

- •Respectful
- •Responsible
- •Ready to Learn

As a part of normal development, all children are in different stages of learning the important skills associated with being **R**espectful. In our school, being respectful is often demonstrated by using kind words and keeping self-to-self throughout each day. Learning to have successful interactions with peers can be similar to how students gain the skills needed to read or solve math problems. With every skill we teach, we understand that each child moves at their own pace, some requiring more practice, time, and patience. Regardless, we are here to help everyone.

As we move through the spring, our students will continue their development. Along with positive growth, your children will likely face challenges with classmates, including other children they may often consider friends. These challenges are to be expected and provide great opportunities to teach our children how to respond to those occasional difficulties. Learning how to be a good friend, classmate, and citizen is not always easy, but is essential.

To further support these positive interactions at school, we ask our families to regularly review these expectations with their children at home. It is important for our families to remind their children that sometimes activities permitted at home, such as with siblings or in the neighborhood, are not appropriate in school. At times, we have found it difficult for our students to recognize the differences in expectations across the different environments. Those activities not permitted at school, on the school bus, or at the bus stop may include teasing or unwanted physical contact, including terms students will often describe as "joking" or "play-fighting." Very rarely are incidents of physical contact intended to be malicious or hurtful; however, they result in the continued need to learn appropriate school-behaviors. If a student receives unwanted physical contact from another student, we teach our students to respond safely, and not with continued physical contact. First and foremost, students are encouraged to remove themselves from any unsafe situation. Then, they are encouraged to seek the support of adults. Again, we understand that these interactions are often innocent and perhaps playful in nature; however, they do conflict with the environment that best serves our students at school. Another way that our families can support our students with their development is to consider volunteering during recess. For volunteers who have completed the volunteer training, we welcome you to sign in at the front office and lend an extra set of hands during any and all of our recess shifts (10:45 - 1:45) as frequently as you are able. To serve as a volunteer, please follow these simple steps:

- 1. Child Abuse Training
 - a. Review PowerPoint Slides
 - b. Print and sign your certificate of completion.
- 2. Volunteer Training Course
 - a. Review PowerPoint Slides
 - b. Print and sign your certificate of completion.
- 3. Complete our HES Google Form to record your training completion.

Bring your completed certificates to school prior to your first day of volunteering.

As we continue along this journey, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher for guidance in how to best support your child. Our School Counselors, Mrs. Kennedy and Ms. Plotkin, are readily available and work with our students every day to navigate the challenges associated with typical peer conflict. They also serve as a great resource to families.

Spring Break begins on Monday, April 11th and continues through Monday, April 18th. Students and staff will return to school on Tuesday, April 19th. Please enjoy this time with friends and family!


FROM SPECIAL EDUCATION: Friday, April 1st is Celebrate Neurodiversity Day!



NEW ANNOUNCEMENTS AND IMPORTANT REMINDERS

From the Health Room:

If your child tests positive for Covid-19 or is a close contact to a positive case, please email the following information to the Health Room staff (Melissa_Rozgonyi@hcpss.org) and Front Office (Lisa Castaneda@hcpss.org) regarding your child's absence:

Positive Test:

- Date the symptoms began (if any)
- Vaccination status & date of last vaccination
- Type of Covid test taken (PCR or rapid) and date

Close Contact to a Positive Individual if not Vaccinated:

- Date of exposure (if close contact)
- Vaccination status & date of last vaccination
- If your child is a household close contact can the positive family member be completely isolated from the child?
- Has your child had a confirmed positive Covid-19 test within the last 90 days

Health and Safety Precautions

Please complete a <u>COVID-19 Self-Screening</u> with your child every morning. Scheduled volunteers should also complete a <u>COVID-19 Self-Screening</u> prior to entering the building.

OUTDOOR RECESS, OUTDOOR EATING & COLD WEATHER

We will offer outdoor lunch as weather and staff coverage permit. Please have a conversation with your child about where you would like them to eat. If your child is eating outside, please make sure they are dressed appropriately for the weather. If you choose to have your child eat inside, all students have an assigned seat.

The decision to go outside or stay inside for recess, outdoor eating, P.E., or any other outdoor activity is the decision of the administrator at individual schools and based on the following criteria:

-Temperature and humidity - Falling precipitation (more than a sprinkle)

-Wind chill -Heat index and air quality

-Age of students -Length of time outdoors

-Condition of the playground -Thunder and lightning

Generally, it is assumed that students will be outside for recess, outdoor eating, P.E., or any other outdoor activity when the temperature combined with the wind chill is not less than 20 degrees

Fahrenheit or the heat index reading is less than 95. Please be sure children are dressed appropriately for the weather.
