ASSESSMENTS

Measure of Academic Performance (MAP) Testing

MAP Test Results

MAP test results are entered in Synergy the Friday after a student takes the test. It can take up to 24 hours to become visible for an individual student. The Detailed PDF home report will be available in Synergy in early May.

FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

If your child tests positive for Covid-19 or is a close contact to a positive case, please email the following information to the Health Room staff (<u>Melissa_Rozgonyi@hcpss.org</u>) and Front Office (<u>Lisa_Castaneda@hcpss.org</u>) regarding your child's absence:

Positive Test:

- Date the symptoms began (if any)
- Vaccination status & date of last vaccination
- Type of Covid test taken (PCR or rapid) and date

Close Contact to a Positive Individual if not Vaccinated:

- Date of exposure (if close contact)
- Vaccination status & date of last vaccination
- If your child is a household close contact can the positive family member be completely isolated from the child?
- Has your child had a confirmed positive Covid-19 test within the last 90 days

Health and Safety Precautions

Please complete a <u>COVID-19 Self-Screening</u> with your child every morning. Scheduled volunteers should also complete a <u>COVID-19 Self-Screening</u> prior to entering the building.

• **Summer Scholars (rising 6th graders):** The Howard County Office of the Local Children's Board in partnership with HCPSS and Leaders of Tomorrow Youth Center is excited to announce registration has opened for our Summer Scholars program. Summer Scholars is a FREE middle school summer program (rising 6, 7 and 8) focused on math and social and emotional learning. Students who qualify for this program are both those who qualify financially as measured by their eligibility for FARMS, WIC and/or SNAP and take on grade level math, received a C or above in math this school year, and scored between the 40th and 60th percentile on Measures of Academic Progress (MAP). This will be the fifth year of this program and we are excited to expand the program to serve 200 students.
