

MESSAGE FROM ADMINISTRATION

Dear Families,

It's hard to believe we are nearing the completion of a month of school! Students have done a phenomenal job settling into their school and classroom routines. We are so proud of them! Staff and teachers have also worked tirelessly to create warm and welcoming environments for them to engage in daily.

We know it has been a bit of a rollercoaster with arrival, dismissal, and start and end time changes, but this has not impacted the amazing relationship making and engaging instruction inside the building. With the new start time, we want to remind parents/guardians who drop off in the mornings that **there will not be staff to supervise students outside until 8:30 am.**Although there may be middle schoolers arriving and entering their building, **elementary school students should remain in their cars or buses until 8:30** when our staff arrive on duty. We want to ensure that there is an adult at each crosswalk that students access in order to enter the building safely. This is especially important because there may be middle school buses in motion in the bus loop. Thank you for partnering with us to keep all students safe. ATTENDANCE MATTERS - please note these procedures

ABSENCE REPORTING - Find these links *always* on the front page of the school website

Is your child not coming to school today?

For general, daily absences: Please complete this <u>Google Form</u> to report your child's absence. This form will alert the school of your child's absence and will serve as an absence note for your child's return. You are not required to send a separate note after completing this form. If your child has been absent for multiple days due to illness, a doctor's note may be required.

Is your child traveling or attending an event keeping them from coming to school? These Extended/Discretionary absences, meaning travel or other non-illness-related absences: Use this form for an extended or discretionary absence, meaning absences of choice. These are unexcused absences unless approved by the principal. FOR ABSENCES OF UP TO 3 DAYS, the principal may determine whether the absences will be lawful/excused or unlawful/unexcused.

Is your child arriving late to school? Your child must be in their classroom by 8:45am

<u>Tardiness should be a rare occurrence</u> and avoided to the best of your ability. You may think a few minutes isn't a big deal, but it can be. It is disruptive to the teacher, your child's classmates, and to the front office. It also puts your child behind to the start of their day. Let's work together to give your child the best start to their day possible. Please do your very best to have them in their classroom by 8:45. You may need to look at your morning routine if you are noticing a trend of being tardy. Perhaps set your alarm a few minutes earlier. We appreciate your attention to this very important issue.

Procedure: You will need to park and escort your child into the building. Parents must sign any tardy students in on the appropriate sheet. It is not necessary to call nor do you need to use the absence reporting forms. Simply come to school and sign them in.

Children dropped off without a parent signing them in will be given an **unexcused tardy**.

*Understandably, medical/dental appointments happen occasionally during a school day resulting in an excused tardy.

Will your child be having an EARLY DISMISSAL?

Procedure: Do not call the front office. We cannot call your students down for dismissal until you have signed them out in the vestibule.

- 1. Email teacher as a courtesy so they can be prepared for the dismissal.
- 2. Come to the vestibule outside the front office and sign your child out.
- 3. Be prepared to present your photo id upon request.

*Note: Students can only be released to parents or individuals listed on their Emergency Contacts list, so please be sure your Family File is up-to-date.

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

All volunteers must complete a Confidentiality Training Course about protecting the privacy of our students, staff, and schools, and the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Training about reporting any suspicion of child abuse or neglect to Howard County Department of Social Services. All training information can be found on the front page of our school website. Once you complete the courses, which take 10 or so minutes, please print out the certificates and give them to the front office prior to your volunteer shift or email them to Amy_Stanilaus@hcpss.org. These need to be completed every year, before any volunteer shift at HES.

CREATE A LUNCH ACCOUNT WITH LINQ

HCPSS no longer will use Nutrislice for school menus or MySchoolBucks for meal payments. <u>LINQ Connect</u> is a secure, online portal that allows families to view breakfast and lunch menus, make online meal payments, monitor their child's account, schedule

automatic recurring payments, set up low balance alerts, submit a Free and Reduced Meals program application, and more. Details and information are available online.
